


Fig.99: Pottery from Enclosure A ditch. Grey Clay. 1:4




Fig. 100: Pottery from Enclosure A ditch. Grey Clay. 1:4




Fig. 101: Pottery from Enclosure A ditch. Grey Clay. 1:4.




Fig.102: Pottery from Enclosure A ditch. XII. 1:4




Fig.103: Pottery from Enclosure A ditch. XII. 1:4
